The growing importance of civil rights rhetoric in the debate over U.S.

immigration policy, DeLaet asserts, helps to explain the liberalization of U.S. immigration policy in spite of growing evidence that the public opposition to immigration has grown during the same period. However, as DeLaet illustrates, the new restrictions adopted in 1996 contain many of the same loopholes as previous legislation, indicating the coalition of interest groups

supporting immigration still pose a significant obstacle to efforts to restrict immigration.
