Several of the Contexts sections in the volume have been expanded—notably “The Place of Women in Society,” which now includes material concerning the Contagious Diseases Acts) and “Britain, Empire, and a Wider World,” which now includes a section on the Great Exhibition of 1851. The volume will also include additional visual material—including four more pages of full color illustrations. Inevitably, some selections have been dropped from the bound book; these will all remain available, however, on the anthology’s website component. The most significant change in that direction is Dickens’s *A Christmas Carol*. As well as remaining available on the website, that work—like *Hard Times*, *Great Expectations*, and approximately 100 other titles from the Victorian period, is available as a stand-alone volume in the *Broadview Editions* series, and may be added

(at little or no additional cost to the student) in a shrink-wrapped combination package.
