Eventually focusing on the role of captivity in Latin American literature, Oper é convincingly shows how the captivity genre evolved over time, first to promote territorial

expansion and deny intercultural connections during the colonial era, and later to romanticize the frontier in the service of nationalism after independence. This important book is thus multidisciplinary in its concept, providing ethnographic, historical, and literary insights into the lives and customs of Native Americans and their captives in the New World.
