Guided Instruction is a set of teacher behaviours based on what the student knows and what the student still needs to know. During Guided Instruction the Teacher: Re-teaches a skill or strategy with necessary modifications.

Planning a Guided Discussion. Choice of topic. Students have some knowledge to exchange. Make assignments to provide background. Establish lesson objective and criteria

How to Facilitate Discussions

Conduct the discussion without trying to direct the group to a particular outcome. Achieve learning objectives. Instructors need not be as neutral as facilitators, but you should strive to bring out the voices in the group, saving "teaching" behaviors until the group has explored the subject.

Guided Peer Discussions - Goalbook

Give students complete responsibility for the post-reading discussion. This a great break from the "teacher-asks-questions-and-students-answer" routine AND it gives students more ownership of the comprehension conversation. You might choose a discussion leader and write down a question or two to guide the conversation.

Guided Peer Discussions are discussions between students where the teacher provides scaffolding and specific tools to facilitate the discussion.

Guided Peer Discussions allow teachers to use strategies in a natural

context to support student growth in communication, expression, and language discourse.

When it appears students have adequately discussed the ideas presented during a guided discussion, one of the most valuable tools an instructor can use is a session of verbal testing. an interim summary of what the students accomplished. a written test on the subject discussed.
