To teach guided reading, you'll need to determine your students' instructional reading level (IRL). The easiest way to do that is to use a chart provided by your school to identify what level each student reads at.

Peregrine teaches 1st grade and has 5 groups of students for her small group guided reading

time. She sees 2 of these groups every day; two of these groups every other day; and the final group 1-2 times per week.

Guided reading has always been one of my favorite parts of the day. It's a time for me to work with small groups of students to help them become stronger, more confident readers. I meet with at least 2 groups a day for 15-20 minutes (groups are flexible and based on skill/reading level). My struggling readers work with me each day.

Guided reading is all about practice, so have students whisper read (or silently read – in late first grade and second grade) all of the words on their own.
