Faculty Observation Process We recommend a three-part process for conducting classroom observations and providing feedback for case instructors. Ideally, the observer attends class and provides feedback twice over the course of an instructor's teaching term. Before Class 1. Plan the observation.

Guidelines for Informal Classroom Observations. Informally Observe as Often as Possible The presence of a principal, supervisor, or coach in classrooms sends a positive message to teachers: the leadership of the school cares. Including informal classroom observation as a school-wide initiative requires consistency and frequency.

### **Rethinking Classroom Observation - Educational Leadership**

Systematic classroom observation is a quantitative method of measuring classroom behaviors from direct observations that specifies both the events or behaviors that are to be observed and how they are to be recorded.

### **Principles of Classroom Observation at Allegheny College**

The observation enables the collection of classroom data. During the post-observation debriefing, the teacher and observer team collaboratively examine the data collected and discuss what the data indicate about the relationship between teaching and student learning in terms of the teacher's focus.

Schools should develop a clear policy for classroom observation with the aim of raising standards of teaching in schools". Where classroom observation is successful leaders also encourage other kinds of professional learning, development and team work.

### **BEST PRACTICE GUIDELINES: CLASSROOM OBSERVATIONS**

Observe the entire classroom Look for qualities of

independence, self-discipline, social interaction, attention, concentration and joy. In the teacher look for: awareness of class dynamics, sensitivity to individual children, helps the children initiate work, provides requested assistance, and demonstrates use of materials through individual lessons.

### *Guidelines for Informal Classroom Observations | Education ...*

1) Teacher evaluations should include two to three annual classroom observations, with at least one of those observations being conducted by a trained observer from outside the teacher's school. 2) Classroom observations that make meaningful distinctions among teachers should carry at least as much weight as test-score gains in determining a teacher's overall evaluation score when both are available.

### **Guidelines for Effective Observation of Case Instructors**

A classroom observation is a formal or informal observation of teaching while it is taking place in a classroom or other learning environment. Typically conducted by fellow teachers, administrators, or instructional specialists, classroom observations are often used to provide teachers with constructive critical feedback aimed at improving their classroom management and instructional techniques.

### *Guidelines for Behavioral Observations - TeacherVision*

Guidelines for Classroom Observations 1. Classroom observations are prohibited unless scheduled in advance and approved by the building principal. The parent/legal guardian must submit a written request to the principal stating the purpose and nature of the observation. Generally, only one parent may observe a classroom at any one time. 2.
