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Guidelines for Discussing Difficult or High-Stakes Topics ...

Combine the book reading with a regularly scheduled discussion meeting to double the impact of the book. Ask one employee to lead the discussion about the week's assigned chapter or two. Ask a second employee to lead the discussion about the relevance of the book's teachings to your organization.

How to lead a successful book club discussion

Tips for taking part in a book discussion: Avoid the words "like" and "dislike." They aren't helpful in moving discussions forward, and can make others feel... Support your views. Use specific passages from the book as evidence for your ideas. This is a literary analysis... Take notes as you read. ...

Guidelines for Leading Book Discussion Don't permit two or more discussions to go on simultaneously. Tell something about the author either at the beginning of the discussion, but leave comments by literary critics for the end. Be a leader, not a lecturer. Prepare questions to bring out discussion. Don't try to get a right answer.

Have a good topic of discussion to start the conversation and make sure to have some more ready to introduce if the conversation flags, goes off topic, starts to repeat itself or gets uncomfortably contentious. Many books suitable for book clubs have discussion guides. If the book you're discussing has one it's certainly worth printing it out - but do look through it before the discussion opens and decide which topics you think your group will enjoy.
