Abstract: Guidelines for the evaluation of educational programs have been designed to cover a broad spectrum of applications by suggesting step-by-step procedures for gathering, analyzing and interpreting information on attitudes, functions, or achievement. The CSE model is focused on "when" to evaluate, pointing out developmental phases during which the target audience could effectively assimilate information, rather than "how" to conduct the evaluation.
