Francis BACON, in his *Novum Organum*, Robert BOYLE, in his *Skeptical Chemist* and René DESCARTES, in his *Discourse on Method*; all of these men were witnesses to the th scientific revolution, which, in the 17 century, began to awaken the western world from a long sleep. In each of these works, the author emphasizes the role of the experimental method in exploring the laws of Nature, that

is to say, the way in which an experiment is designed, implemented according to tried and tested techniques, and used as a basis for drawing conclusions that are based only on results, with their margins of error, taking into account contemporary traditions and prejudices.
