The animal-rights organization PETA asked “ Are Animals the New Slaves? ” in a controversial 2005 fundraising campaign; that same year, after the Humane Society rescued pets in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina while black residents were neglected, some declared that white America cares more about pets than black people. Drawing on recent debates on black lives and animal welfare, Afro-Dog reframes the fast-growing interest in human – animal relationships by positioning blackness as a focus of animal inquiry, opening new possibilities for animal studies and black studies to think side by side.
