After slavery, potlikker sustained the working poor, both black and white. In the South of today, potlikker has taken on new meanings as chefs

have reclaimed it. Potlikker is a quintessential Southern dish, and The Potlikker Papers is a people ’ s history of the modern South, told through its food. Beginning with the pivotal role cooks and waiters played in the civil rights movement, noted authority John T.
