Once the war erupted, one segment of the civilian population in particular was the target of Hitler's fury; Jews. The result was the Final Solution, a technologically and bureaucratically sophisticated system of camps for incarcerating or exterminating European Jews that the Germans put into place between 1941 and 1942.
