Long Shaft Outboards and Short Shaft Outboard Motors

A short shaft is 15 inches long, a long shaft 20 inches long and an extra-long shaft 25 inches long. Measure from the bottom of your outboard's engine compartment down to the bottom of the cavitation plate -- the horizontal metal wing above the propeller. If the measurement lies between 19 and 21 inches, it's a short shaft.
