**How To Answer "What Are Your Salary Requirements?" - Zippia**

Provide a salary range The employer will very likely want a specific number, so another strategy is to give them a number or a range. Assuming your target salary is \$47,000, you could say: I ' m looking for a position which pays between \$45,000 and \$52,000 for a 35-hour work week.

Also, keep your range somewhat tight with a variance of no more than \$5,000 to \$10,000.

Your goal is to arrive at a reasonable salary range that seems fair based on market value and your current or most recent salary. This way, if pressed, you can name a number that's based on real data and

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position it as the market range and not just what you want.

#### **Salary Requirements**

Highlight your skills. In your answer, you can subtly emphasize why you're a good fit for the position. You can say something like, "Based on my 10 years of experience in this field, I would expect a salary in the range of \$Y to \$Z." Before mentioning any numbers, remind the interviewer why he or she should offer you a salary in the first place.
