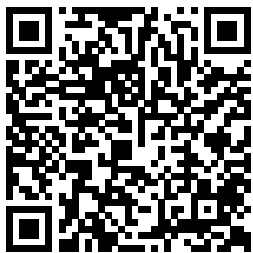

In the end, it's also an account of the very human staffers who risk a life in politics out of conviction and learn to survive a broken heart.
