As is evident, researchers from diverse disciplines such as linguistics, computer science, philology, and vyakarana are collaborating with the scholars from other disciplines, witnessing the growth of Sanskrit computational linguistics as an emergent discipline. We are grateful to S.D. Joshi, Jan Houben, and K.V.R. Krishnamacharyulu for accepting our invitation to deliver the invited speeches.
