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Take a moment to review what an evidence-based practice is and what considerations go into effectively implementing an intervention. For a practice or

intervention to be defined as evidence-based, it must undergo sufficient scientific evaluation to be proven effective (e.g., intervention is considered valid or proven because it is strongly linked to a desired health outcome).
