In Europe, heterodox and creative thinkers could find sanctuary in other countries and spread their thinking

across borders. In contrast, China ' s version of the Enlightenment remained controlled by the ruling elite. Combining ideas from economics and cultural evolution, A Culture of Growth provides startling reasons for why the foundations of our modern economy were laid in the mere two centuries between Columbus and Newton.
