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These class cartoons and explanations may be shared in small groups, with some being discussed with whole class. Student work should be evaluated by using a rubric. Later, in other units, political cartoons, could be incorporated within lessons to reinforce the student knowledge base of interpreting political cartoons in a more objective way.
