This book is about the decision-making processes which result in the release of serious offenders back into 'the community'. It has become an increasingly high-profile issue amongst both public and the media, and raises a number of important concerns and questions. Are too many offenders being released, or is it a question of inadequate supervision on release? Or should we learn to live with the uncomfortable fact that some offenders will unpredictably re-offend? At the same time, the number of ex-prisoners in the community who are recalled to

prison, very often simply because they are causing their supervisors significant concern and not because they have re-offended, is at a record high.
