The Sickness Unto Death (Danish: Sygdommen til Døden) is a book written by Danish philosopher Søren Kierkegaard in 1849 under the pseudonym Anti-Climacus. A work of Christian existentialism, the book is about Kierkegaard's concept of despair, which he equates with the Christian concept of sin, which he terms, "the sin of despair." Kierkegaard and Death – Patrick Stokes While Kierkegaard contemplated death, even suicide, to free himself from the inauthenticity that masked despair, preparing his soul for a leap of faith, Poe projected his anxieties into tales rife with agnosticism. In Poe's day, melancholy also had a resurgence in the cult of mourning.

Kierkegaard wrote The Sickness Unto Death under the pseudonym "Anti-Climacus,"

the same pseudonym under which he wrote his two most important religious works, The Sickness Unto Death and Practices in Christianity. The "sickness" in the title is despair: despair is the sickness that everyone has until they die.
