L'Associazione Italiana per il Patrimonio Archeologico Industriale (AIPAI), in occasione dei suoi 25 anni, ha promosso i Secondi Stati Generali del Patrimonio Industriale. Per tracciare un bilancio ed elaborare strategie e visioni ha posto le condizioni per l'incontro tra gli addetti ai lavori e il confronto tra i molteplici ambiti operativi, di

ricerca e istituzionali coinvolti. Ci si è riuniti a Roma e a Tivoli con la consapevolezza che il primo lascito dell'età industriale siamo noi, la nostra società con i suoi pregi e le sue contraddizioni, le incredibili conquiste degli ultimi secoli. La risposta è stata ampia e tra i numerosi contributi presentati in questo volume, si possono scorgere studi e appelli, buone pratiche di conservazione e progetti di riuso, percorsi culturali e azioni di valorizzazione del patrimonio intangibile. Il tutto fa ben constatare che pur con impianti metodologici fortemente caratterizzati, sono sempre di più le discipline che

convergono sull'oggetto e sui contesti della produzione e gradualmente assimilano i principi consolidati dell'archeologia industriale. Le voci di una comunità segnata dai due anni di pandemia mostrano più incisivamente il divario tra il permanere di emergenze culturali e ambientali, da un lato, e un' aumentata tensione al riconoscimento e al ripensamento dell'eredità industriale, dall'altro. Quest'ultima si conferma sia nella centralità che le memorie e la cultura industriale hanno assunto nelle strategie di ripresa dei programmi nazionali ed europei, sia nelle potenzialità di riscatto sociale

economico e ambientale che emergono da una declinazione aggiornata dei progetti di recupero e rigenerazione. The Italian Association for Industrial Archaeological Heritage - AIPAI, on its 25th anniversary, promoted the Second States General of Industrial Heritage. In order to draw a balance sheet and elaborate strategies and visions for the near future, it set the conditions for the meeting of insiders and the confrontation between the many operational, research and institutional spheres involved. We gathered in Rome and Tivoli with the awareness that the first legacy of the industrial age is us, our society with its merits and contradictions, the incredible achievements of the last centuries. The response was wide-ranging, and among the contributions presented in large numbers one can discern in-depth studies and denunciations, good conservation practices and reuse projects, cultural paths, and actions to enhance intangible heritage. All of which makes a good case for the fact that more and more disciplines, even with strongly characterized methodological frameworks, are converging on the object and contexts of production and are gradually assimilating the established principles of industrial

archaeology. The voices of a community marked by the two-year pandemic show more incisively the gap between the persistence of cultural and environmental emergencies, on the one hand, and an increased tension to recognize and rethink industrial heritage, on the other. The latter is confirmed both in the centrality that industrial memories and culture have assumed in the recovery strategies of national and European programs, and in the potential for social economic and environmental redemption that emerges from an updated declination of recovery and regeneration projects.

The Dark Side of the Landscape Firenze University Press
Celebrated landscape architect Gilles Clément may be best known for his public parks in Paris, including the Parc André Citroën and the garden of the Musée du Quai Branly, but he describes himself as a gardener. To care for and cultivate a plot of land, a capable gardener must observe in order to act and work with, rather than against, the natural ecosystem of the garden. In this sense, he suggests, we should think of the entire planet as a garden, and ourselves as its keepers, responsible for the care of its complexity and diversity of life. "The Planetary Garden" is an environmental manifesto that outlines Clément's interpretation of the laws that govern the natural world and the principles that should guide our stewardship of the global

garden of Earth. These are among the tenets of a humanist ecology, which posits that the natural world and humankind cannot be understood as separate from one another. This philosophy forms a thread that is woven through the accompanying essays of this volume: "Life, Constantly Inventive: Reflections of a Humanist Ecologist" and "The Wisdom of the Gardener." Brought together and translated into English for the first time, these three texts make a powerful statement about the nature of the world and humanity's place within it.

The book aims to provide city administrators and planners with a tool to accompany them in experimenting with the regeneration of no longer used parts of the built heritage, called leftovers, by adopting an innovative approach. A new and radically different form of project, with the task of proposing a new aesthetic code and a style of thought aimed at creating shelters for nomads of the third millennium. In the design field, the 21st century will be destined to measure itself against

temporariness and precariousness, also in terms of aesthetic practices. Based on this hypothesis, the text identifies the design of the unfinished as the perspective for attributing to the leftovers a character, which is representative of the conditions of the just begun century. Through a transdisciplinary, exhibition-like and reversible approach, the elements of degradation of the existing work are welcomed in the project as a "gift", to be translated into a syntax aimed at giving form and meaning to the internal and external environments, with the inclusion of "additional components".

Fundamental Trends in City Development Alinea Editrice

This book explores new forms and modalities of relations between people and space that increasingly affect the life of the city. The investigation takes as its starting point the idea that in contemporary

societies the loss of our relationship with place is a symptom of a breakdown in the relationship between ethics and aesthetics. This in turn has caused a crisis not only in taste, but also in our sense of beauty, our aesthetic instinct, and our moral values. It has also led to the loss of our engagement with the landscape, which is essential for cities to function. The authors argue that new, fertile forms of interaction between people and space are now happening in what they call the ‘intermediate space’, at the border of “urban normality” and those parts of a city where citizens experiment with unconventional social practices.

This new interaction engenders a collective conscience, giving a new and productive vigor to the actions of individuals and also their relations with their environment. These new relations emerge only after we abandon what is called the “therapeutic illusion of space”, which still exists today, and which binds in a deterministic manner the quality of *civitas*, the associative life of people in the city, to the quality of urban space. Projects for the city should, instead, have as their keystone the notion of social action as a return to a critical perspective, to a courageous acceptance of social responsibility, at the same time as seeking the generative structures of urban life in which *civitas* and *urbs* again acknowledge each other.

Smart and Sustainable Planning for Cities and Regions Springer

Walkscapes deals with strolling as an architecture of landscape. The work is the result of years of research across sciences, arts, design, ethnography, cultural geography, performed by multiple researchers, understanding the Relational Ecosystems of cities (the flows of relation,

information, knowledge and emotion in the city) and using them to reinterpret the concept of Urban Acupuncture: from the Third Space, Third Landscape and Third Generation City, to the Third Infospace; from Urban Acupuncture to Digital Urban Acupuncture. The book starts by exploring the many theories and methodologies which have been used to try to capture and use the revolutionary potential found in the daily lives of cities. From De Certeau, to Latour, Bateson, Bhabha, and all the way to Castells, Clément, Boyd, Casagrande. In a progression which moves from the Third Space (Soja, De Certeau), to the Third Landscape (Clément), to the Third Generation City (Casagrande), to the Third Paradise (Pistoletto), the book arrives at a definition of the Third Infospace, following up on Kevin Lynch: a

new legibility and imageability of the city. Its main themes and objectives lie in the desire to observe and understand the radical transformation of the definitions, boundaries and configurations of what we call public and private spaces, in different cultures and communities, in the age of communication, information and knowledge, and to use these understandings to formulate a set of working hypotheses for the positive, constructive, active and participatory usage of these transformed scenarios, contributing to the re-definition of concepts such as citizenship, city-governance, urban planning, civic decision-making, and more. And using, in the process, techniques such as Urban Acupuncture, Actor-Network Theory, Diasporic analysis, Peer-to-peer Urbanism and more. Multiple real-life research

scenarios and documented case studies will be used, from 4 continents, coming from our research and from other international contributions.

In the panorama of studies related to the ability of lands to support both natural processes and

agricultural production activities, this research focuses on the research introduces a still unexplored or under-studied theme which is that of the relationship between urban sprawl in its various forms and land quality. The first part of the book is dedicated to the motivations and the theoretical premises from which the research originates, connected to the concept of land and those of sustainable urban form. The second part concerns the complex path towards a sustainable use of land, both in terms of institutional and regulatory measures, and in terms of knowledge and understanding of soil degradation processes. This Mediterranean area which is discussed in more detail in the third part. In this part of Europe we try to establish relationships between settlement dynamics and land quality: here fragile ecosystems are diffused both from a biological point of view. physical as well as socio-economic, here we find landscapes that are particularly sensitive to land degradation processes (subject to land degradation, considered the antipodes of land quality) and which in recent decades have been particularly affected by anthropic pressure. In the fourth part, an analysis is presented concerning 76

metropolitan areas representative of southern Europe. The methodology used in this analysis is based on the relationship that exists between soil sealing (or soil waterproofing) and land degradation (or land degradation) aimed at an interpretation, at the metropolitan scale, of how in southern Europe the pattern of Urbanization (compact, dispersive, intermediate) affects the land's ability to support both natural processes and agricultural production activities in a diversified way. In particular, the data on land quality and data on land use were considered together in order to analyze the processes of urban growth and the occupation of productive land for a very large area that includes Greece, France, Italy, Spain, Portugal and some parts of the Adriatic coast. There is still a long way to go, in terms of sharing, integration and definition of strategies aimed at achieving certain targets. A necessary and innovative look towards land quality could help to consider the protection of the soil as a whole, even at the planning level.
