He is noted for anticipating many social and scientific inventions including photography, synthetic food and television. Different concepts of *Flesh* are investigated, not only concerning the architectural and aesthetic, but also the biological aspects. The latter is materialised in form of *Synthetic Neoplasms*, which are proposed as new semi-living entities, rather than more commonly derived from scaled-up analogies between biological systems and larger scale architectural constructs. These 'neoplastic' creations are identified as partly designed object and partly living material, in which the line between the natural and the artificial is progressively blurred.
