All of the tasks were developed in research studies to assess emergent literacy in young children.

Reading Recovery, Marie M. Clay and a trainer from New Zealand, Barbara Watson, came to Ohio State to provide the training and to help conduct the research of the pilot study. In New Zealand, leveled reading materials used in classroom instruction were established as benchmarks of progress in text reading.

Rubric for Scoring Marie Clay's Observation Survey
The traditional Marie Clay Assessment is then scored out of
fifteen points and a Stanine group can be determined based on
student results. Student A was given an alternative format of
the test, which contained thirty words for the student to identify.
Student A correctly identified twenty-eight out of the thirty
words.
