He threw his last pitch from a big-league mound at an improbable fifty-nine. (“ Age is a case of mind over matter, ” he said. “ If you don ’ t mind, it don ’ t matter. ”) More than a fascinating account of a baseball odyssey, Satchel rewrites our history of the integration of the sport, with Satchel Paige in a starring role.
