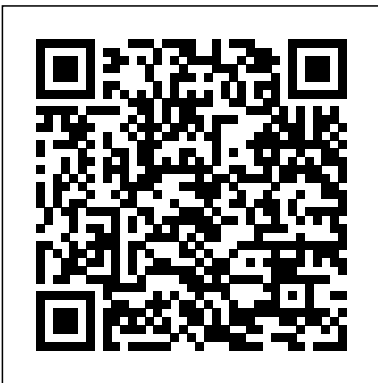

Since 1936, the National Park Service and a growing cadre of environmentalists and recreationalists have fought to block ongoing proposals from miners, ranchers, private

landowners, and real estate developers who historically have refused to accept the idea that any desert is suitable for anything other than their consumptive activities.
