Four-time Formula One Drivers' Champion Alain Prost is one of the best racing drivers of all time. Having discovered karting at the age of 14 during a family holiday, Prost progressed through motorsport's junior ranks, winning the French and European Formula Three championships, before joining the McLaren Formula One team in 1980 at the age of 24. In his six seasons with McLaren, Alain Prost won 30 races and three driving titles and in 1985 he became the first French World Champion. In 1986 he became the first back-to-back champion since Jack Brabham 26 years earlier. In 1987, his 28th Grand Prix victory beat Jackie

Stewart's 14-year-old record. However, in 1988 his brilliant new team mate Ayrton Senna won eight races and the driving title. Thus began the sensational rivalry that conspired to push two of the sport's greatest drivers to unprecedented heights of success and controversy, and the most bitter feud in Formula One history.

Michael Schumacher, born on 3rd January 1969, Hürth, North Rhine-Westphalia, West Germany, is a retired racing driver who raced in Formula One for Jordan Grand Prix, Benetton and Ferrari, where he spent most of his career, followed by Mercedes upon his return to the sport. Widely regarded as one of the greatest Formula One drivers ever, Schumacher is the only driver in history to win 7 Formula One World Championships, 5 of which he won successively. Michael also holds the records for the most Grand Prix wins (91), the most fastest laps (77) and the most races won in a single season (13), being "statistically the greatest driver the sport has ever seen" at the time of his retirement from the sport, as stated on the official Formula One website.

" We follow the investigation, the speculation, and expert testimony to a problematic conclusion—countered by an alternate theory that the Anderson ' s captain maintained to his dying day. By declaring the Edmund Fitzgerald an official gravesite, Canada closed the wreck to further exploration. But here the exploration continues, providing a unique, and uniquely enlightening, perspective on this unforgettable episode in America ' s maritime history.

Capp himself was a familiar personality on TV and radio; as a satirist, he was frequently compared to Mark Twain.
