Motor neurone disease (MND) is a life-limiting, rapidly-progressing disease that affects the brain and spinal cord. MND attacks the nerves that control movement so muscles no longer work. It does not usually affect senses, for example sight, sound and touch.

Motor Neurone Disease / NRS Healthcare

About 10% of MND is 'familial'; that is, there is or has been more than one affected person in a family. The remaining 90% of people with MND are the only affected person in their family and are said to have 'sporadic' MND. People with familial MND have the disorder because of a mutation in a gene.

Does MND run in a family or have a genetic connection?
growth, repair and ageing of motor neurons. Familial (hereditary) MND accounts for about five to 10 percent of cases. Several gene mutations have been identified since 1993, and current research aims to identify further genes linked to MND. The majority of cases, 90 to 95 per cent, are sporadic.

About 5% of people with motor neurone disease have a close family relative with the condition or a related condition known as frontotemporal dementia. Motor neurone disease – NHS - NHS

Motor neurone disease (MND) is a progressive condition that damages the nervous system, leaving muscles wasted and weak, and causing loss of mobility, and difficulties with speech, swallowing and breathing. MND tends to affect people over 40 and is most common between the ages of 50 and 70.

Motor neuron diseases or motor neurone diseases (MNDs) are a group of rare neurodegenerative disorders that selectively affect motor neurons, the cells which control voluntary muscles of the body. They include amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS), progressive bulbar palsy (PBP), pseudobulbar palsy, progressive muscular atrophy (PMA), primary lateral sclerosis (PLS), and monomelic

amyotrophy (MMA), as well as some rarer variants resembling ALS.

We can easily test for faults in the four commonest genes in those MND patients who have also had a close family member with the condition (this is called having a 'family history' of MND). These genes are called C9orf72, SOD1, FUS and TARDBP. There are a growing number of other genes which have been associated with MND (more than 20 at present), but these are very rare, and currently routine testing is not available.
