Although nothing subsequently prompts examination of the musculoskeletal system, it is possible that this section not only increased the frequency of documentation of musculoskeletal symptoms (50 vs 14.5% in the previous study) but also increased awareness of the need to assess musculoskeletal problems when examining patients.

Rheumatologists commonly begin by examining the upper extremities followed by the trunk and lower extremities, but many routines may be effective, provided that a systematic, consistent approach is used.

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The general musculoskeletal examination (GMSE) is designed to build directly on the sequence and techniques taught in the screening musculoskeletal examination (SMSE). It is intended to provide a comprehensive assessment of joint inflammation through the use of palpation and will enable you to recognize the important physical finding of joint swelling, essential to diagnosing arthritis.

A few general comments about the musculoskeletal exam. Historical clues when evaluating any joint related complaint: What is the functional limitation? Symptoms within a single region or affecting multiple joints? Acute or slowly progressive? If injury, what was the mechanism? Prior problems with the affected area? Systemic symptoms?
