POPULATION STUDIES has been written for New Zealand NCEA Level 1 Geography students studying population topics in New Zealand and/or Monsoon Asia. These topics are assessed by Achievement Standard 90203 and Unit Standard 5084. Rather than surveying all the countries of Monsoon Asia, this book focuses more closely on population trends in the major nations, India, China and Japan. In both the New Zealand and Monsoon Asia sections, information is organised in line with NCEA assessment criteria: Distribution patterns of the population. Migration movements and associated issues. Changes relating to population size, structure and related issues. Most of the terminology and theory is introduced in the New Zealand chapters. A research activity in Chapter 8 (people trafficking) could be used to

assess Achievement Standard 90205 or Unit Standard 5082. This, and other population issues discussed in the Monsoon Asia section could be adjusted to suit Achievement Standard 90207 or Unit Standard 5086. The many activities throughout the text help to develop skills in map and graph drawing and interpretation, research, application of geographic ideas and other thinking skills. These are assessable in Achievement Standard 90205. Some photocopyable map and graph outlines are included for student use.

Media education in Asia is a relatively young, but rapidly developing part of the curriculum. Research has been conducted and papers

have been written on various issues concerning media education in Asia. The dominant models of media education in the world are broadly Western and most are drawn from English-speaking countries. The question is whether a similar pattern exists in Asia, where there may be differences in culture, heritage, beliefs, values, education policy, as well as curriculum and pedagogy.
