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III-32 Wound Care Guidelines

These Guidelines send a clear message that the nutritionist cannot take a "back seat" in the wound care process.

Nutritional assessments for persons at risk for or having wounds should be timely, with special attention given to malnutrition and weight loss, with provision of proper calories and fluids.

Billing Guidelines Wound Care (CPT Codes 97597, 97598 and 11042-11047)
1. Active wound care procedures are

performed to remove devitalized and/or necrotic tissue to promote healing. Debridement is the removal of foreign material and/or devitalized or contaminated tissue from or adjacent to a traumatic or infected wound until surrounding healthy tissue is exposed.

wound management guidelines | Evidence search | NICE

To ensure proper healing, the wound bed needs to be well vascularized, free of devitalized tissue, clear of infection, and moist. Wound dressings should eliminate dead space, control exudate, prevent bacterial overgrowth, ensure proper fluid balance, be cost-efficient, and be manageable for the patient and/or nursing staff.
