To ensure proper healing, the wound bed needs to be well vascularized, free of devitalized tissue, clear of infection, and moist. Wound dressings should eliminate dead space, control exudate, prevent bacterial overgrowth, ensure proper fluid balance,

be cost-efficient, and be manageable for the patient and/or nursing staff.

Active wound care procedures are performed to remove devitalized and/or necrotic tissue to promote healing. Debridement is the

removal of foreign material
and/or devitalized or
contaminated tissue from or
adjacent to a traumatic or
infected wound until
surrounding healthy tissue is
exposed.
