CPG 101 incorporates the following concepts from operational planning research and day-to-day experience: The process of planning is just as important as the resulting document; Plans are not scripts followed to the letter, but are flexible and adaptable to the actual situation; Effective plans convey the goals and objectives of the intended operation and the actions needed to achieve them. Successful operations occur

---

when organizations know their roles, understand how they fit into the overall plan, and are able to execute the plan. Comprehensive Preparedness Guide (CPG) 101 provides guidelines on developing emergency operations plans (EOP). It promotes a common understanding of the fundamentals of risk-informed planning and decision making to help planners examine a hazard or threat and produce integrated, coordinated, and synchronized plans. established regional collaboration as one of the major priorities within the National Preparedness Guidelines, and development of regional all-hazards incident management teams across the nation assist in serving this priority. The problem is the Linn County/Cedar Rapids metropolitan area does not have a regional incident management team to manage large-scale incidents in all affected communities.
