Psychological Crisis Intervention: The SAFER-R Model is designed to provide the reader with a simple set of guidelines for the provision of psychological first aid (PFA). The model of psychological first aid (PFA) for individuals presented in this volume is the SAFER-R model developed by the authors. Arguably it is the most widely used tactical model of crisis intervention in the world with roughly 1 million individuals trained in its operational and derivative guidelines. This model of PFA is not a therapy model nor a substitute for therapy. Rather it is designed to help crisis interventionists stabilize and mitigate acute crisis reactions in individuals, as opposed to groups. Guidelines for triage and referrals are also provided. Before plunging into the step-by-step guidelines, a brief history and terminological framework is provided. Lastly, recommendations for addressing specific psychological challenges (suicidal ideation, resistance to seeking professional psychological support, and depression) are provided.

This manual instructs preservice and inservice criminal justice personnel in how to intervene in crises involving domestic violence, child abuse and neglect, elder abuse, and suicide.

Following an introduction to the rudiments of crisis intervention, the author discusses methods for crisis assessment and conflict management in both general and criminal justice settings. Procedures for successful intervention are detailed and subsequently applied to particular types of crises. An overview of domestic violence considers the ineffectiveness of the criminal justice system in dealing with it, its nature and extent, contributing factors, participant profiles, and the cycle of violence. After detailing crisis intervention steps for domestic violence, diagrams, role plays, and situational information are provided to help upgrade the reader's intervention skills. The overview of child abuse and neglect analyzes it as a social process, with legal issues impacting to define the nature and extent of the crisis. Intervention strategies are proposed. The chapter on 'elder abuse' synthesizes elder abuse theories to present a societal problem expected to grow in the future. Effective strategic procedures for individual interveners and policymakers are presented. A subsequent chapter on suicide intervention presents information on the theory and processes of suicide prevention and intervention, the incidence of suicide, and causal factors. Assessment and intervention approaches are described. Chapters on how to reduce stress and avoid professional burn out and on techniques for teaching crisis intervention conclude the book.

Section 4: Deals with supporting families of children with intellectual disability, genetic syndromes and autism spectrum disorders. Section 5: Covers issues associated with intellectual disability first evident or prevalent in middle childhood. Section 6: Deals with adolescent concerns including life skills training, relationships and sexuality. Section 7: Focuses on residential, vocational and family-related challenges of adulthood and aging. Section 8: Deals with professional issues and risk assessment. Chapters cover theoretical and empirical issues on the one hand and practice issues on the other. They close with summaries and suggestions for further reading for practitioners and families containing a member with an intellectual disability. Where appropriate, in many chapters, practice exercises to aid skills development have been included. The second edition of the **Handbook of Intellectual Disability and Clinical Psychology Practice** is one of a set of three volumes which cover the lion's share of the curriculum for clinical psychologists in training in the UK and Ireland. The other two volumes are the **Handbook of Child and Adolescent Clinical Psychology, Third Edition** (by Alan Carr) and the **Handbook of Adult Clinical Psychology Practice, Second Edition** (edited by Alan Carr & Muireann McNulty).
