The subtitles were a smaller font and in a different color. Upon completion of the instruction, Hispanic students were allowed to form monolingual working groups to delve into application. Their worksheets came from the same source but were in Spanish. (c) The researcher examined differences in cognitive domain of both groups using analysis of variance (ANOVA) in pre-test and post-test data from the software NovaNet, as well as data from county-wide semester-final exams. Changes in attitudes regarding mathematics as determined by a student questionnaire were compared with frequency distribution on answers to test questions. Changes in classroom climate were assessed using the Classroom Environment Scale and teacher interviews. (d) The treatment group, [comma uncertain] which exercised the greatest fidelity in experimental guidelines, showed greatest gains in math application skills, while expressing feelings of stronger class affiliation, teacher support, and rule clarity.
