the past, it was thought that omental infarction mainly occurred on the right side because it was detected when surgery was performed on patients who complained of abdominal pain on the right side. Treatment is mainly conservative (analgesia with opiates / NSAIDs) with close observation for 24-48 hours. Surgery may be considered if there are
