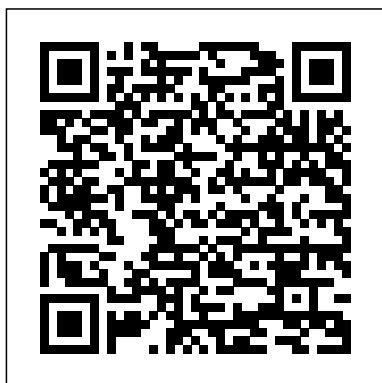

However, the findings also accepted the hypothesis of the study that was assumed as "Daily Jang" portrays the National Action Plan more positively

as compared to "Daily Dawn."
