Theory of Operant Conditioning

Operant conditioning is a form of learning that exists within the science of psychology and is one of two types of conditioning, the other, classical conditioning.

Operant conditioning teaches an organism to respond by thinking, learning, or reacting to a stimulus (Olson & Hergenhahn, 2009).

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Developed by B.F Skinner, operant conditioning is a way of learning by means of rewards and punishments. This type of conditioning holds that a certain behavior and a consequence, either a reward or punishment, have a connection which brings about learning.
