A major aim of this book is to help you develop mathematical maturity—elusive as this objective may be. We interpret this as preparing you to understand how to do proofs of results about discrete structures that represent concepts you deal with in computer science. A correct proof can be viewed as a set of reasoned steps that persuade another student, the course grader, or the instructor about the truth of the assertion. Writing proofs is hard work even for the most experienced person, but it is a skill that needs to be developed through practice. We can only encourage you to be patient with the process. Keep trying out your proofs on other students, graders, and instructors to gain the confidence that will help you in using proofs as a natural part of your ability to solve problems and understand new material. The six chapters referred to contain the fundamental topics. These chapters are used to guide students in learning how to express mathematically precise ideas in the language of mathematics. The two chapters dealing with graph theory and combinatorics are also core material for a discrete structures course, but this material always seems more intuitive to students than the formalism of the first four chapters. Topics from the first four chapters are freely used in these later chapters. The chapter on discrete probability builds on the chapter on combinatorics. The chapter on the analysis of algorithms uses notions from the core chapters but can be presented at an informal level to motivate the topic without spending a lot of time with the details of the chapter. Finally, the

chapter on recurrence relations primarily uses the early material on induction and an intuitive understanding of the chapter on the analysis of algorithms. The material in Chapters 1 through 4 deals with sets, logic, relations, and functions. This material should be mastered by all students. A course can cover this material at different levels and paces depending on the program and the background of the students when they take the course. Chapter 6 introduces graph theory, with an emphasis on examples that are encountered in computer science. Undirected graphs, trees, and directed graphs are studied. Chapter 7 deals with counting and combinatorics, with topics ranging from the addition and multiplication principles to permutations and combinations of distinguishable or indistinguishable sets of elements to combinatorial identities. Enrichment topics such as relational databases, languages and regular sets, uncomputability, finite probability, and recurrence relations all provide insights regarding how discrete structures describe the important notions studied and used in computer science. Obviously, these additional topics cannot be dealt with along with all the core material in a one-semester course, but the topics provide attractive alternatives for a variety of programs. This text can also be used as a reference in courses. The many problems provide ample opportunity for students to deal with the material presented.
