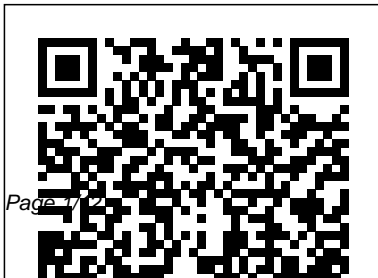

Research into how we learn has opened the door for
