Language Standardization and Language Change describes the formation of an early standard norm at the Cape around 1900. The processes of variant reduction and sociolinguistic focusing which accompanied the early standardization history of Afrikaans (or 'Cape Dutch' as it was then called) are analysed within the broad methodological framework of corpus linguistics and variation analysis. Multivariate statistical techniques (cluster analysis, multidimensional scaling and PCA) are used to model the emergence of linguistic uniformity in the Cape Dutch speech community. The book also examines language contact and creolization in the early settlement, the role of Afrikaner nationalism in shaping language attitudes and linguistic practices, and the influence of English. As a case study in historical sociolinguistics the book calls into question the traditional view of the emergence of an Afrikaans standard norm, and advocates a strongly sociolinguistic, speaker-orientated approach to language history in general, and standardization studies in particular.

Afrikaners Face Black Rule in the New South Africa Oxford University Press, USA

This government and politics book discusses the white Afrikaners' mindset of apartheid and the path to reconciliation, equal rights, and political

realignment in South Africa. President Mandela's stand in negotiations before, during, and after his imprisonment was attainment of universal democratic rights for all citizens in South Africa. His counterpart, President F. W. de Klerk's, condition was the protection of minority rights; a position he knew could not be sustained. He persuaded white Africans to support it until he capitulated and they followed suit. The result was a peaceful transition to black majority rule, but a great number of Afrikaners accepted change of power without rejecting their apartheid ideology. In *The Afrikaner's Emancipation*, author Barry Botha dissects the Afrikaner's apartheid mindset that was based on an attitude of superiority and a false belief that apartheid was scripturally justified. Although most Christian churches rejected apartheid as sin, the largest Afrikaans Protestant Church the Dutch Reformed Church, only did so in 1986. Many Afrikaner Christians still have not accepted this, leading to unfinished reconciliation which affects affirmative action and black economic empowerment issues. Botha believes the future holds exciting opportunities for reconciliation and political realignment, but it depends partly on the Afrikaners confessing their wrong doing and apologizing for its superior attitude. Mutual respect could create harmony among the races and would accommodate differences in political views.

Negotiating Learning and Identity in Higher Education iUniverse

South African universities face major challenges in meeting the needs of their students in the area of academic language and literacy. The dominant medium of instruction in the universities is English and, to a much lesser extent, Afrikaans, but only a minority of the national population are native speakers of these languages. Nine other languages can be media of instruction in schools, which makes the transition to tertiary education difficult enough in itself for students from these schools. The focus of this book is on procedures for assessing the academic language and literacy levels and needs of students, not in order to exclude students from higher education but rather to identify those who would benefit from further development of their ability in order to undertake their degree studies successfully. The volume also aims to bring the innovative solutions designed by South African educators to a wider international audience.
