Long after Tillman's nationally televised memorial service, the Army grudgingly notified his closest relatives that he had "probably" been killed by friendly fire while it continued to dissemble about the details of his death and who was responsible. Drawing on Tillman's journals and letters and countless interviews with those who knew him and extensive research in Afghanistan, Jon Krakauer chronicles Tillman's riveting, tragic odyssey in engrossing detail highlighting his remarkable character and personality while closely examining the murky, heartbreaking circumstances of his death. Infused with the power and authenticity readers have come to expect from Krakauer's storytelling, *Where Men Win Glory* exposes shattering truths about men and war. found where her heart
belonged for the rest of her
life. Lucy Maud
Montgomery (1874 –
1942), was a Canadian
author best known for a
series of novels beginning
with Anne of Green Gables.
Montgomery went on to
publish 20 novels as well as
530 short stories, 500
poems, and 30 essays.
