Over the last few decades, research, activity, and funding has been devoted to improving the recruitment, retention, and advancement of women in the fields of science, engineering, and medicine. First published in 1963, James Baldwin's *A Fire Next Time* stabbed at the heart of America's so-called "Negro problem".
