Philosophical Hermeneutics Hans Georg Gadamer

Hans-Georg Gadamer is the father of contemporary philosophical hermeneutics. He was born and educated in Marburg, Germany, where he studied under Martin Heidegger. Shortly after World War II, he was appointed professor of philosophy at Heidelberg University, a position that he held for almost 20

years, until he retired in 1968.

Hans-Georg Gadamer (1900-2002) was a German philosopher, who wrote other books such as *Truth and Method*, *The Relevance of the Beautiful and Other Essays*, *The Enigma of Health: The Art of Healing in a Scientific Age*, *Heidegger's Ways*, etc. This 1976 book is a translation of essays from Gadamer's *Kleine Schriften* (Small Writings), as well as the essay, "Heidegger's Later Philosophy."
