OpFund Web Portal is a resource for FOs to navigate through the nearly 14,000 OpFund requests submitted by PHAs and the 25 million data elements used to calculate OpFund eligibility. Improving outcomes with Unit 7 community health workers Monitoring and evaluation (M and E) are indispensable components of effective program management. M and E are used for decision-making, to assess and improve the care that patients receive, to share effective practices, and to advocate for unmet needs in the target population.
