Relational Aesthetics Definition. Nicolas Bourriaud defines relational aesthetics as a "set of artistic practices which take as their theoretical and practical point of departure the whole of human relations and their social context, rather than an independent and private space". In different words, relational aesthetics is used to describe all those artistic practices that tend to erase the line which separates spectators from the work of art.
