cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) in the event of a patient's sudden cardiopulmonary arrest. Do Not Resuscitate (DNR)/Do Not Attempt Resuscitation ... The Resuscitation Council (UK) guidelines have been adapted from the 2015 ERC Guidelines and are tailored specifically to clinical practice in the UK. NICE has accredited the process used by Resuscitation Council (UK) to produce its Guidelines development Process Manual. Accreditation is valid for 5 years from March 2015.

Guidelines for Resuscitation: 2017 Update - ERC

(1) An intact, unaltered, easily identifiable plastic identification OOH DNR bracelet, with the word "Texas" (or a representation of the geographical shape of Texas and the word "STOP" imposed over the shape) and the words "Do Not Resuscitate", shall be honored by qualified EMS personnel in lieu of an original OOH DNR Order form. OR

Do Not Resuscitate (DNR), also known as no code or allow natural death, is a legal order, written or oral depending on country, indicating that a person does not want to receive cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) if that person's heart stops beating. Sometimes it also prevents other medical interventions. The legal status and processes surrounding DNR orders vary from country to country.

Do not resuscitate order (DNR) forms are created for patients that do not want to be saved in the event their heart or breathing stops. This is generally the case for individuals with late stages of cancer or other advanced medical issues. The laws for withholding resuscitation are governed by each State and usually comes with the requirement that the patient authorizes the form along with ...

Individual's may use the DNR Order form as identification, a necklace, a bracelet, a wallet card, or a hospital type bracelet. All of these items must contain the DNR Comfort Care logo and the patient's name.

Although state laws vary, it is typical for emergency medical services

personnel who are presented with a valid DNR form, signed by your doctor, or who identify a standard DNR bracelet on you, to comply with the DNR order.

Do Not Attempt CPR model forms

Resuscitation includes, but is not limited to, CPR, cardiac compressions, defibrillation, and artificial ventilation. Although anyone can potentially request a DNR form through their physician, this form is generally reserved for those to whom resuscitation would do more damage than good; i.e., terminally ill or very sick/weak patients.
