Hawthorne's work "The Scarlet Letter" is full of biblical symbols, reverences and up to whole storylines that seem to be very similar to one another. Especially because the "Legal metaphor that runs all through the Bible, [...] sees a man [or in this case a woman] as under a trial and subject to judgement" is also the topic of Hawthorne ?s book.
