It became a best-seller in Europe but was so shunned in America that it also became, in the words of *New York Magazine*, "The Book They Dare Not Review." Since then, both *60 Minutes* and *The New York Times* have corroborated what Sack wrote: that at the end of World

War II, thousands of Jews sought revenge for the Holocaust. They set up 1,255 concentration camps for German civilians -- German men, women, children and babies.
