The study findings also indicate that direct support staff in nonprofits can be inundated with text-based content in online training modules due to federal and state laws requiring that specific topics be covered. In addition, direct support staff can experience a significant level of discomfort with physical restraints, and thus, special attention should be given to restraints training and development. This study identified opportunities via web-conferencing and videos as having benefits for enhancing the on-the-job training experience of teacher counselors.
